

Getting the most from your security system



Set the 'delay' to low

The delay time refers to the amount of time before the alarm sounds after the premises are entered. If you set it too high, this could allow time for intruders to enter and do damage to your property. Bear in mind that it may be a minute or so before police arrive. Hence, setting it to low helps eliminate the risk of intruder entry and interference. Many systems allow you to disarm your system via a keychain before entering the property.

Set your system to 'panic' code

The panic code becomes imperative for situations where an intruder may force you to disarm your system. In this case, you enter your panic code and police are alerted and will attend to your situation as a matter of urgency. Your panic code should be set up within your central station.

Set to 'no delay' when you are on the premises

When you wish to arm the system while you remain in the property, set your system to 'no delay'. This will ensure that the alarm will be activated immediately when an intruder enters.

Use your system at all times

Your security system is designed to protect your property and prevent intruders – but it can only perform its function if it is used. Even if you are exiting the property for a short time, ensure that you arm the system, as you never know when an intruder is intending to break in.
